

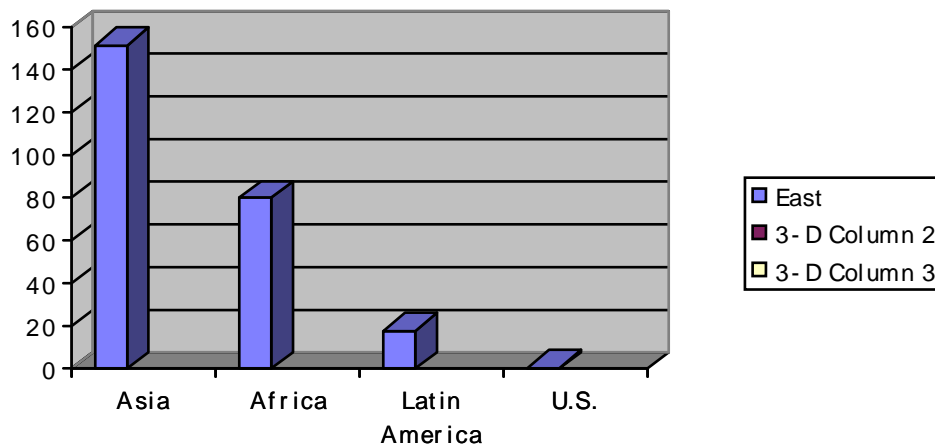
Child Labor World Wide

Thousands of Pakistani children stitch together pieces of leather to make soccer balls. The children are paid 60 cents per ball and can make two balls a day. Factory owners sell the balls for about \$6 each. Sporting goods companies sell the balls for between \$30 and \$50.

Daily earnings of Pakistani children	\$ 1.20
Factory owners sell 2 soccer balls	\$12.00
Value of 2 soccer balls in the U.S.	\$60.00 to \$100

In the United States close to 500,000 children under the age of 14 work in fields or factories.

In 1995, a twelve year old Canadian boy named Craig Kielburger started an organization called Free the Children. The organization campaigns to end child labor.
